Guidelines for Oral Exams in *Landeskunde* and *Sprechfertigkeit*(vertieft and Unterrichtsfach)

"Lehramt VERTIEFT" and "Lehramt UNTERRICHTSFACH (Realschule)" exams must be scheduled with Ms. Höfling (SZ 03.212, Bismarckstr. 10, sz-englisch@fau.de, 09131 85-23469). "Lehramt UNTERRICHTSFACH (Grund-, Mittelschule)" exams must be scheduled with Ms. Manneck (0.038 Regensburger Str. 160, Nürnberg, viola.manneck@zuv.uni-erlangen.de 0911 5302-513) or Mr Mantsch (0.038 Regensburger Str. 160, Nürnberg, richard.mantsch@fau.de, 0911 5302-95785).

Students should pick <u>one</u> topic from the list below. This topic should focus on EITHER the US OR the UK. The test will consist of 15 minutes of questions on the topic of choice and 15 minutes of general knowledge questions. The general knowledge questions will cover <u>both</u> the US and UK.

Five minutes of the specialized topic section will focus on a sub-topic within the student's topic of choice. For example, if a student chooses "Identity" as their topic, they could specialize on the "Chicano Civil Rights Movement".

General knowledge questions will be based on the *Landeskunde* lecture and on the text books *British Civilization* and *American Civilization*. The general knowledge portion of the exam may also contain questions on current events, especially if those current events are related to the candidate's topic of choice. The examiner MUST APPROVE of all topics and sub-topics. Students are STRONGLY ADVISED to meet with their examiner at least FOUR weeks before their exam.
